



BOOK CLUB: January 25, 2024 Under this Unbroken Sky by Shondi Mitchell

"Utterly gripping. Epic in scope, this tale of family feuds, violence and hardship follows the fortunes of Theo Mykolayenko, a Ukrainian survivor of Stalin's labour camps who starts a new life in the harsh Canadian Prairies.

In the spring of 1938, Teodor Mykolayenko returns to his family after nearly two years in prison for the crime of trying to feed them. Given shelter by his sister Anna, his wife, Maria, and their five children barely survived on the harsh and brutal Canadian prairie landscape. Channelling a determination gained from escaping starvation and Stalin's crimes in the Ukraine, Teodor is committed to making a home. With unbending resolve, he takes to the land and as the crops grow, his family heals and strengthens, but their comfort is soon challenged: Anna's rogue husband returns with an unforgivable plan. Mesmerizing and passionate, *Under This Unbroken Sky* is an astonishing tale of family, love, betrayal, and the resiliency of the human spirit.



- Fragile items like glass, porcelain or china. These items may not survive the wrapping, stacking and delivering process
- · Toys requiring adult supervision
- Realistic weapons (except Nerf dart guns)
- Poor quality plush animals. Does it say "This is NOT a Toy"? Are there wires that poke out, loose eyeballs, or extremely hard heads? When you tug on the seams does stuffing come out?



It was a busy year for projects in the Village of Chauvin. Here are just some of the projects completed with Grant monies this year.

Stay tuned for more!

- We had Olson Construction in town this summer fixing and replacing sidewalks mainly along 1st Avenue.
- Council approved the creation of the Chauvin Economic Digital Development Initiative, community members are working diligently on projects and generating new ideas for Economic growth in the Village!
- Regular sewer line root cleaning was done, and lines were inspected with cameras to see if any needed repairs.
- We had so much success with our heat tape that we've added it to more areas of Chauvin to prevent freeze ups in the spring!
- The Chauvin Recreation Board received extra funding from the Village due to a one time increase in grant funding from the Alberta Government. Council allocated all the extra funding to the Chauvin Recreation Board.
- We purchased a new wheelchair for residents that might need one on a temporary basis. This is free to use and is available at the Village Office.
- We purchased a new gas line locator to aid Public Works staff.
- Thank you to Down and Dirty for fixing the Public Works Shop roof to get us through the winter months!
- Thank you to the many businesses and organizations in Chauvin that contributed to the purchase of the Digital Sign on Main Street!
- Thank You to Spectre Systems for doing a major over-haul to the Arena and Hall parking lot! Thank you to the Recreation Board for taking on funding of this huge project!

Village of Chauvin Land Use Bylaw

December 2023 Newsletter #1

HELLO!

The Village is embarking on an important project; to update the Village of Chauvin Land Use Bylaw. The current Land Use Bylaw is 25 years old and does not reflect current requirements. The purpose of the update is to improve the readability of the Bylaw and bring it up to date with current development trends and requirements.

The purpose of Newsletter #1 is to provide residents with background information about the project and outline opportunities for residents to get involved.



WHAT IS A LAND USE BYLAW?

The Land Use Bylaw establishes regulations to guide how land is used and developed. It divides a municipality into different districts or a zoning map, and identifies what uses are either permitted or discretionary for each district.

The Land Use Bylaw also includes procedures for submitting, processing, and deciding upon subdivision and development applications. For some specific land activities, land use regulations are included to provide further clarity on how these activities may be developed in the municipality.

The purpose of a Land Use Bylaw is to separate uses that might conflict with each other, and to protect property owners and residents from developments that may negatively impact the use and enjoyment of your property. The Land Use Bylaw supports the Village's economic development goals and objectives established through the Municipal Development Plan.

After the Public Open House and community members have shared their comments and input in a feedback survey, Municipal Planning Services will compile and summarize all feedback received from community members into a What We Heard Report. The Report will be shared with Council and will be posted on the Village's website for community members to review and shared with the Village Council.







WHEN I WAS growing up, Christmas would never begin without the annual trip our family always made to a very special destination. That special place was my maternal grandmother's home in the town of Ashcroft B.C. - eleven hours distance from our house in Terrace, and at the end of a long drive on, mostly, gravel roads.

In Ashcroft, my grandmother was the unofficial historian for the generations of the Dougherty and Peters families - the ranchers, miners, and pioneers whose triumphs and tribulations were immortalized in the photographs and other memorabilia kept in my grandmother's home. Ashcroft was where my great-grandfather first organized caravans of freight wagons and stage coaches – sending them south through the Fraser Canyon to the coast, and north to the gold-fields of Barkerville. Ashcroft was also where my great-grandfather's only son repaired used "horseless" carriages until his untimely death in 1923 from appendicitis, when his own horseless carriage failed to navigate the sixty miles of bad roads to Kamloops in time to have life-saving surgery. His sudden passing left my grandmother to raise three young children alone and in very difficult circumstances. She persevered, but never remarried. Devoted to her family, she found her greatest contentment in helping her children, and grandchildren, grow up to lead productive lives.

Every family has a history; a record of their journey through the world. In every family, the most cherished stories are usually about those who went "above and beyond" in their willingness to make sacrifices for the sake of others. For people of faith, Christmas is the story of the most cherished sacrifice of all — made by the One who left His home in Heaven, and came to rescue our human family. God sent us His Son, so that our sad history of darkness and loneliness might become a living history of joy, and of light, and of hope; a story about us and God no longer living separate lives, but finding ourselves, instead, suddenly together and on the same journey.

This is the story we celebrate at Christmas - a story of hope for a world that's ready for a different and better story than the one it's presently living. Today, our world is tired; tired of being afraid, tired of the darkness, and in despair over how to fix it. Christmas offers us the opportunity for that to change; to begin a new chapter in our human journey by remembering that we are never alone. Christmas is God's perpetual, wonderful, and loving invitation to step into the Light, and reconnect with Joy, and Hope, and Faith. Christmas shows us the remedy for our despair.

This Blessed Season, let's celebrate the history God has made, and is making, with us all – a joyful history where, after many faltering starts, God and us are finally and truly together - not just for awhile, but forever! And yes, it will be enough to make all the difference.
